



61 year-old male with 3 weeks of right knee pain and feelings of knee instability.







"Broken" bucket handle meniscal tear


- bucket handle tears are longitudinal vertical tears with a displaced fragment
- represent ~10% of meniscal tears
- "broken" bucket handle tears are uncommon injuries, refer to a bucket handle tear with an additional rupture of displaced meniscal fragment
- case demonstrates a bucket handle tear with rupture of the fragment centrally resulting into both anteriorly and posteriorly based segments
